- 1. "Publication purposes" are deemed to apply where DIN Standards are adopted in own works, for example in catalogues, lists of offers, brochures, books, trade journals and similar publications. "Publication purposes" are not deemed to apply in the case of scientific works, for example theses, doctoral dissertations and post-doctoral theses.
- 2. The permission to reproduce extends only to one edition of the publication. A new edition requires a new permission to reproduce.
- 3. Reproductions of complete DIN Standards shall be firmly integrated in the publication. Reproductions of complete DIN Standards in loose-leaf or ring binder systems are only permissible if they are expressly covered by the permission to reproduce and the reproduction clearly differs in its presentation from the original.
- 4. The extent of the reproduction, even if it is an excerpt, may not exceed one third of the entire publication.
- 5. A fee for reproduction shall be paid to DIN in the amount of a percentage of the sales price of the respective reproduced DIN Standard per unit of the publication run; reproduction of excerpts (e.g. individual pages of a DIN Standard) shall be charged according to the extent of the reproduced extract. The percentage share for publication purposes is 4 %. The percentage share is reduced to 1 % if the reproduction is carried out by a textbook publisher for a textbook (i.e. for educational purposes) or by a DIN member for advertising purposes (i.e. to advertise the conformity of its own products to the standard in, for example, catalogues, offer lists or brochures).
- 6. A specimen copy of the finished publication shall be sent to DIN's Legal Department and the final print run shall be communicated.
