- 1. Translation purposes apply when DIN Standards are translated into another language.
- 2. The permission to reproduce a standard extends only to the production of the translation. The translation is therefore only permitted to be used in the same manner as the original version of the DIN Standard (i.e. without further permission for reproduction or distribution).
- 3. Application for permission to reproduce DIN Standards can be made in writing using the online form provided "Request for permission to reproduce DIN Standards", to be submitted to DIN's Legal Affairs Division.
- 4. A distribution permit for purposes of distributing the translation can be requested via email (lizenzanfrage@din.de) from DIN's Legal Affairs Division.
- The presentation of the translation shall not give the impression that it is an official translation published by DIN. The title page of the translation must include the following notice in the language of the translation:
 "Translated by ... This translation has not been checked or authorized by DIN Deutsches Institut für Normung e. V., Berlin."
- 6. The Legal Affairs Division of DIN shall be provided with one file copy of the translation.
- 7. In accordance with the attached declaration "Licence to use translated standards" DIN is to be granted, for an unlimited geographical area and for an unlimited period of time, the exclusive and irrevocable right to use the translation, without limitation, in the development and distribution of the results of standards work (particularly standards, draft standards, supplements, DIN SPECs and draft DIN SPECs) and other products based on these, both in physical and non-physical form, regardless of the format used (particularly electronic formats such as XML or PDF files).
